"Be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect," said Jesus Christ [Matthew 5:48]. Mary wants very much for us to live holy lives which is why our Blessed Mother calls on us to pray the Rosary every day. Mary made her message clear during her apparitions to the three shepherd children of Fatima, Portugal in 1917: We must pray many Rosaries. What better way for faith, hope, and love to live within us and through us than to follow the Rosary's mysteries to Heaven!

The Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, and Glorious mysteries show us that we should not be afraid to open our hearts, to say yes to God's call, to obey His will, to live our faith, and to actively participate in our Lord's plan for peace and salvation for us and for our world. When we meditate on the mysteries, we learn through Jesus and Mary to see beyond our own needs and to go the extra miles to share love and compassion with those in most need of God's mercy. No matter how difficult the journey and the burden, and no matter how often we stumble, if we reach out to God with love, sincerity, and repentance in our hearts, God will give us the graces to complete our purpose in this world in order to reach Heaven's gate.

If the soul is faithful to God, according to St. Faustina, a person can reach the highest levels of holiness one can attain here on earth. #

Mary is our Mother of Hope and the Cause of Our Joy because through her, Jesus came into the world to show us the way to eternal life in Paradise.

By following the way of the Rosary, we too can open our hearts to God and God's grace can shine through us so that we can be a source of joy and hope here on earth and beacons of light that shine toward Heaven. #
